MR. EDWARD DALLAS: My name is Edward Dallas, E-D-W-A-R-D, D-A-L-L-A-S.

I can just talk. I'm just concerned here 4 5 about something that's not being expressed here is the tar sands themselves. How much environment has 6 7 to be destroyed in Canada to get to the tar sands 8 and then to make them liquid enough, the oil in 9 there, to move through this pipeline. And I just think that that's a wrong thing to do. 10 Because I 11 know how much they have to rip off the surface of the ground, the forest and everything else, to get, 12 13 literally get to the tar sands. And then to take them out, heat them up enough to make it liquid 14 15 enough to, quote, move through a pipeline.
