**THIRD CONTINUANCE ORDER**

On July 23, 2020, the Administrative Law Judge continued the two public hearings scheduled to take place in the afternoon and evening of July 28, 2020. This was done because Scout Clean Energy sold Three Waters Wind Farm, LLC, (Applicant) to Twin Wind, LLC, on July 14, 2020.

On July 30, 2020, the Applicant advised the Judge that it intends to use the remainder of the calendar year to work with the community, landowners, and state agencies before making determinations about how to proceed with the wind farm project. Applicant advised that any amendments to the applications will be filed in 2021. The Judge was concerned with the indefinite nature of the suspension of the regulatory process and the impact that suspension will have on public participation in that process.

As a result, on August 13, 2020, the Judge convened a conference call with the parties (Applicant and Department of Commerce Energy Environmental Review and Analysis unit) and PUC staff. The Judge discussed Applicant's request, the scheduling of the public hearing, and whether the applications should be withdrawn pending Twin Wind's review of the project with the participants. The Judge then spoke with the Executive Secretary of the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (PUC). The PUC delegated administrative authority, including scheduling and timing issues to the Executive Secretary.<sup>1</sup>

It is the policy of the State of Minnesota that the siting of Applicant's proposed wind farm be conducted in an orderly way, compatible with environmental preservation, sustainable development, and the efficient use of resources.<sup>2</sup> There are three legal requirements in fulfilling this policy that are central to the Administrative Law Judge's analysis of the schedule in this matter. One is that the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) must make a timely final decision on siting and certificates of need (180 days and 12

months from acceptance of applications, respectively).<sup>3</sup> These timelines may be extended.<sup>4</sup> Another requirement is that the public be involved so that “public opinion on the necessity of granting a certificate of need and. . . a site or route permit” is obtained for consideration by the PUC.<sup>5</sup> Finally, the PUC is to “take all reasonable actions. . . to maximize benefits to Minnesota citizens” in reaching the State’s renewable energy objectives.<sup>6</sup> These requirements drive the Administrative Law Judge’s determination in this Order.

This Order is intended to help the Twin Wind, LLC, to conduct its due diligence to be sure its investment in the Applicant will be appropriately beneficial. It is also intended to meet the State’s regulatory objectives concerning renewable energy, an orderly regulatory process, and public participation and input in the decision-making about the applications. The overall intent is to maximize the benefits of the project to Minnesota citizens - which does not predispose the project to a particular outcome.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. 14.50 (2020)<sup>7</sup>, Minn. R. 1400.5500, .7500, 1405.1100 (2019), other applicable law, and the record in this matter,

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

1. A prehearing conference will be convened by telephone at **9:30 a.m.** on **Wednesday, September 30, 2020**. At that time, the parties will dial **888-742-5095** and use conference code **685 684 1864#**.

2. The purpose of the prehearing conference will be to set the final schedule for the public hearing, and related events, on the applications. The following parameters will guide the prehearing discussion:

- (a) Two public hearings will occur on the same date. One will be held at 1:00 p.m. and the other at 6:00 p.m. They will be held via WebEx. The proposed possible dates for the hearing are December 9 and 10, 2020.<sup>8</sup>
- (b) The public comment period will end on January 5, 2021.
- (c) The Applicant may file a response to any public comments no later than January 15, 2021.

- (d) The Applicant may file proposed findings of fact and permit conditions no later than January 19, 2021.
- (e) The Department may file comments on Applicant's proposed findings of fact and permit conditions no later than February 2, 2021.
- (f) The Judge will issue the report ordered by the PUC no later than March 5, 2021.<sup>9</sup>

3. The Applicant may file a request to withdraw its applications with the PUC at any time. The Applicant, however, must inform the Administrative Law Judge in writing if it files a request to withdraw.


